## November 2, 2010

The regular meeting of the Weston County Commissioners convened at 9:00 a.m. with Chairman Tom W. Bruce presiding. Present for the meeting were Commissioners: Tom Bruce, Glen Hutt, Randy Rossman, Jerry Shepperson, Alan Todd, and County Clerk Paulette Thompson.

### Good of the Order

Commissioner Shepperson gave the Invocation and Chairman Bruce led the delegation in the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **Approve Minutes**

A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting as published. Carried.

## Accept Collections

A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to accept the collections from the County Clerk in the amount of \$6,087.50 and the Clerk of District Court in the amount of \$1,766.32. Carried.

## Public Health Nurse-Emergency Preparedness Grant

Public Health Nurse Lori Bickford discussed the Emergency Preparedness contract. The Commissioners had taken action at their last meeting to terminate the contract with the state. Lori explained that the State has indicated that they will enter into an agreement with Steven Huerta to provide the services for the rest of the contract period if the County will continue with the grant agreement and allow for an amendment to accommodate the proposed changes. A motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Shepperson, to amend the previously adopted motion terminating the Emergency Preparedness grant, ratify the state contract and nullify the contract between Steven Huerta and Weston County effective today. This motion carried unanimously. The County Attorney will draft the termination document. At a later time, a motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Shepperson, to authorize the Chairman to sign the notice of termination of contract prepared by the County Attorney. Carried.

## **Revival Agreement to Bioterrorism-Emergency Preparedness Agreement**

Public Health Nurse Lori Bickford explained that a 4<sup>th</sup> quarter allocation of the Bioterrorism Emergency Preparedness grant had not been spent during the contract period. The state has now offered to extend the time, revive the contract and extend the contract period. A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to authorize the revival agreement and hold a hearing to consider amending the fiscal budget if necessary. Carried.

#### Public Health Assessment Agreement

Public Health Nurse Lori Bickford presented an agreement with the State of Wyoming that allows the Public Health Nurse's Department to perform the LT101 assessments for long term care home and community based services. A motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Todd, to sign the contract agreement. Carried.

#### **Investment Disclosure**

Tamera Cleverdon, Assistant Deputy Treasurer, submitted the investment disclosure document required of the Weston County Treasurer's office employees. A motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Shepperson, to accept the Disclosure of Investment. Carried.

#### **Employee Appreciation Day**

A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to give the day after Thanksgiving to the county employees as an Employee Appreciation Day. Carried.

#### LEPC Agreement

A motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Todd, to approve the contract for the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) in the amount of \$2,396.22

and propose to advertise to amend the budget by increasing the budget by the amount of the grant and transfer \$599.06 from 100.00.20.0099000.0000 to the LEPC project account as the required local match. Carried. A budget amendment hearing will be held on December 7<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m.

The meeting recessed at 10:16 a.m. and reconvened at 10:30 p.m.

## **Sheriff's Department Report**

Sheriff Bill Ware and Undersheriff Brian Colvard presented the Sheriff's Department report of revenues and expenses. The oath of office was given to Deputy Sheriff Derek Thompson by the County Clerk. Sheriff Ware presented cost estimates for new pickups for his deputies. A motion was made by Commissioner Hutt, seconded by Commissioner Shepperson, to authorize the Sheriff to purchase two long-wheel based pickups and to include a maximum set-up cost of \$7,000.00 for each. Carried. This purchase will be paid from Impact funds. A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Hutt, advertise and hold a hearing to consider amending the 2011 fiscal budget by transferring \$77,774.00 from the Impact Reserve Account into the fiscal 2011 operating budget for expenditure. The hearing will be held on December 7<sup>th</sup> at 10:00a.m. Carried.

The meeting recessed at noon for lunch and reconvened at 1:30 p.m. with all present.

## Fair Building Project

Mr. Kyle Gillette, Schutz Foss Architects, reviewed the bids for the construction of the proposed fair building. The low bid was from Paul Reed Construction. Per Mr. Gillette's recommendation, a motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, to accept the base bid in the amount of \$895,511.00 from Paul Reed Construction and award the bid to the contractor. Carried. Mr. Gillette will work with the contractor on the alternate biding issue.

## County Road Project

Fran Lehman presented a project report. She updated the Commissioners on her recent activities.

# **Mallo Construction Project**

Ray Pacheco met with the Commissioners to discuss the bids for the Mallo Emergency Flood Damage project. Commissioner Shepperson declared a potential conflict of interest and left the meeting. Mr. Pacheco explained that two bids had been received; one from Tom Farnsworth and one from Dan Hart. After discussion, a motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, to award the bid to Tom Farnsworth. The motion died for lack of a second. A motion was made by Commissioner Todd, seconded by Commissioner Hutt, that Dan Hart be awarded the bid upon receipt of a proper bid bond and proof of insurance. Motion carried with a vote of 3 ayes and 1 no.

#### **Purvis Road Discussion**

Mr. Mike Burleson discussed the Purvis Road with the Commissioners. They answered questions and listed to his comments. Mr. Burleson has been requested to give a county road easement through his property.

Commissioner Rossman left the meeting at 3:30 p.m.

# Road and Bridge Department Report

Rick Williams presented the Road and Bridge Department report. A representative from RDO was present to discuss the proposed purchase of a used grader. A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Hutt, to authorize the purchase of a John Deere 2006 772D motor grader and accept a trade-in offer for a 140G Cat in the amount of \$52,000.00 for a total cash difference of \$159,000.00. Carried. The purchase had been budgeted in this year's fiscal budget.
