## December 4, 2012

The regular meeting of the Weston County Commissioners convened at 9:00 a.m. with Chairman Tom W. Bruce presiding. Present for the meeting were Commissioners: Tom W. Bruce, Marty Ertman, Randy Rossman, Lenard D. Seeley, Jerry Shepperson and County Clerk, Mamie C. Krank.

#### **Good of the Order**

Commissioner Shepperson gave the invocation and Commissioner Ertman led the Delegation in the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **Upton Industrial Park - Traffic Study**

A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to authorize Chairman Bruce's signature on a Business Ready Community (BRC) Planning Grant Application for a traffic study to be completed in the Upton Industrial Park. The application requested \$25,000.00 in funding with a local match of \$5,000.00. Carried.

#### **Rare Element Resources**

Mike Finn, Rare Element Resources (RER), met with the Commissioners to discuss progress of the mine located outside of Sundance, WY. Mr. Finn invited the Commissioners and public to attend an RER open house at 504 Pine, Upton on December 14, 2012, from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. or the Sundance Office on December 13, 2012, from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Commissioner Rossman left the meeting at 9:18 a.m. and returned at 9:23 a.m.

### **Accept Collections**

A motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Ertman, to accept the collections of the District Court in the amount of \$1,958.60 and the collections of the County Clerk in the amount of \$8,012.75. Carried.

### **Rescinded Motion**

Commissioner Shepperson made a motion regarding shock collars, and then rescinded the motion. No action was taken.

### **Budget Hearing - Homeland Security**

A motion was made by Commissioner Seeley, seconded by Commissioner Shepperson, to set a Budget Amendment Hearing for December 18, 2012, at 10:00 a.m., to consider increasing the General Fund because of unanticipated revenues for four (4) Homeland Security Grants. Carried.

## **Approve Minutes**

A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to approve the minutes of November 15, 2012, as published. Carried.

## **WyoLink Agreement**

A motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Shepperson, to approve and authorize Chairman Bruce's signature on a WyoLink Membership Agreement between Weston County Homeland Security and the State of Wyoming for a public safety wireless communications system. Carried.

# **CLG Historic Preservation Board**

A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Ertman, to reaffirm action to allow Chairman Bruce to sign the annual report for the CLG Historic Preservation Board. Carried.

# **Prairie Dogs**

The Commissioners discussed a letter received from Robert Harshbarger concerning a Joint Subcommittee on Federal Natural Resources Meeting to be held on December 11, 2012, in Douglas. Commissioner Seeley committed his attendance; Commissioner Ertman stated that she would contact Commissioner Elect Tracy Hunt and request his attendance. No action was taken.

# <u>USFS</u>

The Commissioners discussed a letter received from the United States Forest Service, Regional Forester, regarding mine and cave abandonment, due to a bat disease. There is a thirty day comment period; the Commissioners decided to write a letter within the comment period. No action was taken.

### **Budget Amendment Hearing – Homeland Security HMEP**

The hour being 10:00 a.m. Chairman Bruce opened a Budget Amendment Hearing to consider increasing the Fiscal Year 2013 Budget because of unanticipated revenue in the amount of \$2,250.09 for Homeland Security Grant HMEP. Chairman Bruce called for public comment, hearing none; the public comment portion of the hearing was closed at 10:02 a.m. A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to accept the Budget Amendment for Homeland Security/HMEP in the amount of \$2,250.09. Carried. Chairman Bruce closed the Budget Amendment Hearing at 10:03 a.m.

The meeting recessed at 10:04 a.m. and reconvened at 10:13 a.m. with all present.

#### **Board Appointment Hearing – Weston County Fair Board**

The hour being 10:15 a.m. Chairman Bruce opened a Board Appointment Hearing to consider appointment for the unexpired term on the Weston County Fair Board. Weston County received one letter of interest for the position from Craig Deveraux. Chairman Bruce called for public comment. Robert Bonnar spoke on behalf of appointing Craig Deveraux to the Fair Board. The public comment portion of the hearing was closed at 10:17 a.m. The Commissioners and Mr. Deveraux discussed many concerns including personal conflicts, ethics and board training. A motion was made by Commissioner Ertman, seconded by Commissioner Shepperson, to appoint Craig Deveraux to the unexpired five-year term on the Weston County Fair Board. This term will expire in January 2014. Carried. The Board Appointment Hearing was closed at 10:41 a.m. The Commissioners congratulated Mr. Deveraux on his appointment to the Weston County Fair Board.

#### **Board Appointment Hearing - Weston County Solid Waste Board**

The hour being 10:42 a.m. Chairman Bruce opened a Board Appointment Hearing to consider appointment for the unexpired term on the Weston County Solid Waste Board. Weston County received one letter of interest for the position from Bert Sutherland Sr. Chairman Bruce called for public comment, hearing none; the public comment portion of the hearing was closed at 10:44 a.m. A motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Ertman, to appoint Bert Sutherland Sr. to the unexpired four-year term on the Weston County Solid Waste Board (Osage Dump). This term will expire in January 2015. Carried. The Board Appointment Hearing was closed at 10:45 a.m.

# <u>Homeland Security Grant – Coroner</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Shepperson, to accept and authorize Chairman Bruce's signature on a Homeland Security Grant for the Coroner in the amount of \$2,505.00. Carried.

# <u>Homeland Security Grant – Sheriff</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to accept and authorize Chairman Bruce's signature on a Homeland Security Grant for the Sheriff in the amount of \$4,660.91. Carried.

# <u>Homeland Security Grant – Weston County Allocation</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Ertman, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to accept and authorize Chairman Bruce's signature on a Homeland Security Grant for the Weston County Allocation in the amount of \$22,848.44. Carried.

## <u>Homeland Security Grant – EMPG</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Ertman, to accept and authorize Chairman Bruce's signature on the Homeland Security EMPG Grant in the amount of \$30,000.00. Discussion ensued, carried.

## **Public Health**

A motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Shepperson, to accept and authorize Chairman Bruce's signature on an Emergency Preparedness Grant for Public Health in the amount of \$24,000.00. Carried.

### **Wyoming Wolf Coalition**

The Commissioners discussed correspondence from Harriet Hageman, Hageman & Brighton; Bryce Reece, Wyoming Wool Association; and Robert Wharff which discussed a complaint filed in the U.S. District Court challenging Wyoming's wolf management plan.

Commissioner Rossman left the meeting at 10:17 a.m. and returned at 10:20 a.m.

The Commissioners discussed sending \$190.00 to the Wyoming Wolf Coalition as requested in the correspondence. The Commissioners agreed to request a listing of the members and current dues. No action was taken. Commissioner Rossman returned to the meeting.

The meeting recessed at 11:20 a.m. and reconvened at 11:26 a.m. with all present.

### **Sheriff's Department**

Sheriff Colvard met with the Commissioners and gave the department report including monthly fees and accounts receivable for October and November 2012. The Youth Services reports for September through November 2012 were reviewed by the Commissioners. Sheriff Colvard informed the Commissioners that Deputy Joe Creamer had resigned. Sheriff Colvard discussed an accident involving livestock on the highway. Sheriff Colvard also conveyed that there is possible legislation being introduced concerning state owned fences and how to protect the landowners or livestock owners from litigation. No action was taken.

The meeting recessed at 11:55 a.m. and reconvened at 1:25 p.m. with all present.

#### **Farm School Program**

Stacey Madden, Youth Development Educator and Vicki Hayman, Ag Director, met with the Commissioners to discuss the success of the newly implemented Farm School Program. The educational opportunities of the Farm School Program will again be offered to youth participants next year. Vicki Hayman discussed the need for additional funds in the travel budget because of Ms. Madden's required travel. The Commissioners requested Mrs. Hayman compile and present an estimate before the budget amendment is authorized. No action was taken.

### **Wyoming Water**

Ed Kiesling, concerned citizen, met with the Commissioners to discuss concerns regarding water issues. Mr. Kiesling is part of a group called the "Clean Water Alliance" and discussed a proposed uranium mine in South Dakota which would use approximately nine-thousand gallons of water per minute. Mr. Kiesling voiced concerns about the contamination of Wyoming ground water and requested a Resolution be drafted by the Commissioners to oppose the project. The Commissioners requested Mr. Kiesling keep them informed and stated that they appreciated the information. No action was taken.

## **Courthouse Furniture**

Susan Overman, Treasurer and Tina Conklin, Assessor, met with the Commissioners to discuss the purchase of office chairs.

Commissioner Ertman left the meeting at 2:05 p.m. and returned at 2:29 p.m.

Mrs. Overman stated that office chairs had been priced in both Rapid City and locally. Ad Pro Office Supplies offered a quantity discount for the purchase of eight chairs. A motion was made by Commissioner Shepperson, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to authorize the purchase of eight office chairs for the Treasurer and Assessor's Offices at an approximate cost of \$3,000.00. Carried.

The meeting recessed at 2:13 p.m. and reconvened at 2:29 p.m. with all present.

### **Upton Fairview Road**

Fran Lehman, GIS Coordinator, met with the Commissioners to discuss progress on gaining easements for the Upton Fairview Road. Mrs. Lehman stated she has been unable to obtain an easement from Glennis G. Kuemmerle after repeated attempts. A motion was made by Commissioner Rossman, seconded by Commissioner Ertman, to begin the prescriptive easement process on a portion of the Upton Fairview Road owned by Glennis G. Kuemmerle. Discussion ensued, carried. The recorded votes are as follows: Yea: Commissioners Shepperson, Rossman and Ertman; Nay: Commissioner Seeley. Mrs. Lehman stated she would

contact Don Hansen, Weston County Attorney, to request the process for prescriptive easement be started on this property.

The meeting recessed at 2:55 p.m. and reconvened at 3:05 p.m. with all present.

#### **Fairgrounds Road**

Fran Lehman, GIS Coordinator, met with the Commissioners and presented two Right of Way consent forms to establish a County Road for the Fairgrounds Road. A motion was made by Commissioner Seeley, seconded by Commissioner Rossman, to accept both Right of Way's for the Fairgrounds Road and authorize Chairman Bruce's signature. Carried. Chairman Bruce signed the documents in front of a notary. Both documents will be recorded in the Weston County Clerk's Office.

### **Gravel Crushing**

Joni Kachelhoffer, WY DOT, met with the Commissioners to discuss a gravel crushing and stockpiling agreement. A motion was made by Commissioner Ertman, seconded by Commissioner Shepperson, to authorize Chairman Bruce's signature on a Cooperative Agreement between Weston County and WY DOT for gravel crushing and stockpiling in the amount of \$300,000.00. Discussion ensued. Carried.

#### **Road & Bridge Department**

Rick Williams, Road & Bridge Foreman, met with the Commissioners and gave the department report. Mr. Williams discussed the D-8 dozer which the Commissioners had previously authorized him to purchase. Mr. Williams stated that this dozer is too large for Road & Bridge to haul, and he will look for a smaller piece of equipment. Darrell Schlup, Tri-Star Surveying, presented a preliminary survey for a portion of the Salt Creek Road. Commissioner Rossman volunteered to meet with the Ackerman's to discuss the preliminary survey. Fran Lehman and Rick Williams discussed adjustments on the Raven Creek Road. Mr. Williams related to the Commissioners that he had been contacted by Daniel Bau concerning repairing a cattle guard on the Clay Spur Road. The Commissioners stated that the cattle guard in question on the Clay Spur Road is the responsibility of WY DOT, not Weston County. No action was taken.
