

**TEN O'CLOCK RULE
ALLOWING PERSONS UNDER 18 IN DINING AND WAITING AREAS FOR ALL LIQUOR LICENSEES
APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF WESTON COUNTY, WYOMING**

WHEREAS, Wyoming Statute 12-5-203(a) restricts minors from entering dispensing rooms and provides exceptions for all licensees approved by the Board of County Commissioners of Weston County, Wyoming. W.S.12-5-203(a) reads, "No licensee or agent, employee or servant thereof shall knowingly permit any person under the age of eighteen (18) years to enter or remain in the licensed room or rooms where alcoholic or malt beverages are dispensed. No person under the age of eighteen (18) years shall enter or remain in the licensed room or rooms where alcoholic beverages are sold unless:

WHEREAS, Wyoming Statute 12-5-203 (a)(ii) provides an exception and reads, "With the approval of the local licensing authority, in a dining or waiting area with an adult not later than 10:00 p.m. if the dining or waiting area is part of the licensed room."

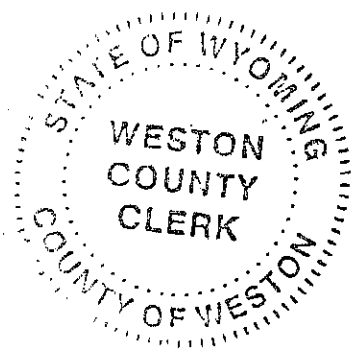
IT IS RESOLVED that any person under the age of eighteen (18) years of age may enter and remain in the licensed room or rooms where alcoholic beverages are sold if the person is in a dining or waiting area with his or her parent or legal guardian who has attained the age of eighteen (18) years of age not later than 10:00 p.m., if the dining or waiting area is part of the licensed room.
