RESOLUTION WESTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
Abolishment of Justice of the Peace Court

WHEREAS, the State of Wyoming, pursuant to Laws 2000, Chapter 24, Section 6 has provided that the Board of County Commissioners may, by resolution, abolish a Justice of the Peace Court effective at the conclusion of the term of office of the current presiding Justice of the Peace; and


WHEREAS, there is currently established in Weston County a Justice of the Peace Court, the term of office of whose presiding Justice of the Peace extends through the first Monday in January, 2003; and


WHEREAS, the Wyoming Supreme Court, in order to adequately address budget requests for the upcoming biennial budget including the first half of calendar year 2003 needs confirmation from those counties currently being served by Justice of the Peace Courts of their intention to abolish or retain that Court at the expiration of the current term of the presiding Justice of the Peace.






