

**RESOLUTION on
LEGISLATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL DISTRICTING**


WHEREAS, Each county pursuant to Wyo. Const. Art. 3, § 3, whether original or new, “shall constitute a senatorial and representative district” and each “county shall have at least one senator and one representative . . .”;

WHEREAS, twenty three (23) or more citizens of Weston County have as a Common Law Grand Jury presented as a grievance, and as citizens have Petitioned their government to correct “the deprivation of the right of Weston County to constitute at least one senatorial and one representative district in the Wyoming Legislature” (See: Weston County Grand Jury Presentment and Petition for Grievances on Legislative Constitutional Districting);

NOW THEREFORE, BY THE WESTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, BE IT, AND IT IS HEREBY, RESOLVED that:

1. The Weston County Board of County Commissioners supports the adoption of Constitutional Legislative Districting, including all aspects of Art. 3, Sec. 3, such as giving full effect to the Constitutional requirement that each county “shall constitute a senatorial and representative district” and that each “county shall have at least one senator and one representative.”
2. The County Sheriff, Representative Hunt, Representative Semlek, Senator Driskill, Senator Meier, and other Wyoming Counties, organizations or citizens requesting copies, shall be provided a copy of this Resolution when it has been processed.
