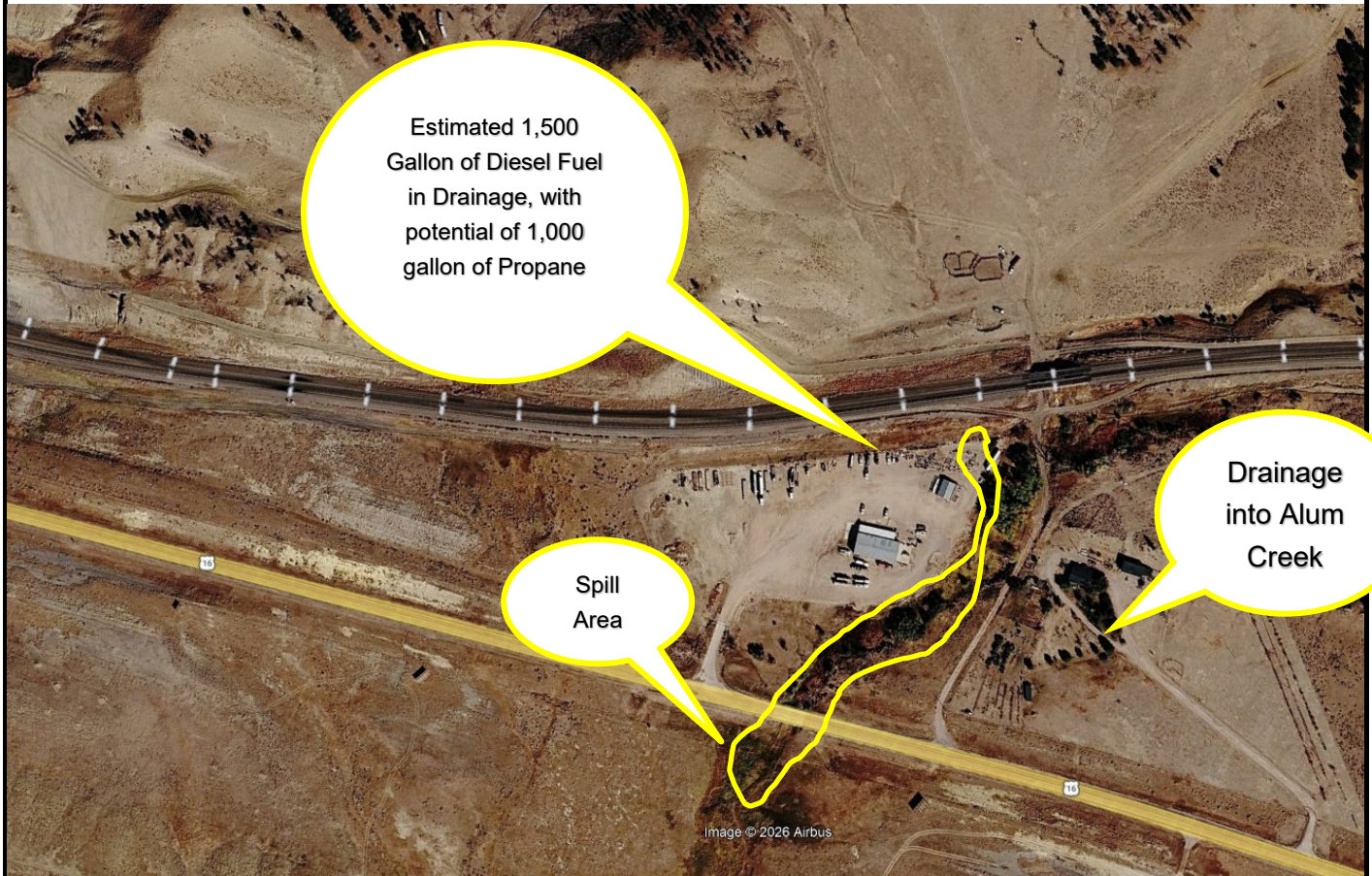
INCIDENT BRIEFING (ICS 201)

Situation Summary and Health and Safety Briefing (for briefings or transfer of command): Recognize potential incident Health and Safety Hazards and develop necessary measures (remove hazard, provide personal protective equipment, warn people of the hazard) to protect responders from those hazards.

On Wednesday August 29th, 2026, at about 1300, the M&K Oil company personnel called 911 informing them of a Hot Oil truck on fire on the north side of the shop and near the railroad tracks. The Hot oil truck was in the process of cleaning out one of the crude tank trailers for repair's when the hot oil truck spung a leak in the heating coils releasing hot diesel fuel and spilling 1,500 gallons of diesel fuel from the tank on the truck into the nearby Alum creek. The diesel fuel and crude oil from the tanker is running south under the US highway 16 bridge.

There are three injuries reported from the fire with the personnel that were involved in the work task. Several (5) other nearby employee have reported having lung issues and difficulty breathing while trying to assist with the incident.

At this time of the incident, the weather conditions were partly cloudy, with a temperature of 97°F and winds at 15 mph from the northwest. The GPS location of the release site was recorded as N43°51.693', W104°15.903'
